kick the bucket (sl.)	to die, to pass away	"The foe has kicked the bucket."
feel-good	relaxing, entertaining	"This is a feel-good movie."
a bomb (sl.)	a failure, not successful	"This movie was a bomb . I didn't like it at all."

be into	be keen on, interested in, eager to	"I'm really into diving. I love it so much."
take up	to start, to commence sth.	"He wants to take up photography."
give up	to leave, to quit, to stop	"She decides to give up working."

allow sth. to take its course	to let sth. to happen	"We have to allow mother nature to take its course."
live on the edge	to live in extreme conditions	"Hasan always likes liv ing on the edge ."
PHRASAL VERBS		
put out	to extinguish, to switch off	"I like putting out candles."
take off	to remove (a dress)	"He can't take off his shirt because the sun shines badly."

all skin and bones	extremely thin, very slim	"She's so slim. She is all skin and bones."
keep up with the Joneses	try not to be outdone by neighbours.	"Stop keeping up with the Joneses."
good-looking	beautiful	"Being a good-looking person is not always enough."
middle-aged	to be between 30s and 60s of age	"I saw a middle-aged person in the hall."
well-built	to have an athletic body	"Ronaldo is an absolutely well-built footballer."
stay up-to-date	to stay informed or modern	"You must always stay up-to-date in this age."
as soon as possible	immediately	"Write to me as soon as possible."
asap / a.s.a.p. (abr.)	= as soon as possible	"See me asap."

hang loose	not tied up	"Her hair is hanging loose ."
come away with	to leave, to step back	"Come away with me."
stand up to sth.	to confront, to fight, to resist	"Stand up to cancer."

with bells on	to do sth. eagerly	"I alwyas love coming her with bells on."

can't take eyes off	can't stand not looking at sth.	
dead tired	extremely tired, exhausted	"He felt dead tired but happy."
PHRASAL VERBS		
pick sb. up	to take by car	"Can you pick me up at 7?"

feel under the weather	to feel sick and tired	"Hey! Are you feeling under the weather?"
think twice	to think well and comprehensively	"Before investing your savings, you should think twice."
kill sb.	to cause extreme pain and suffer	"This headache is killing me ."
get back into shape	to gain a fit body again	"Exercise is really important to get back into shape."
keep in mind	not to forget, to consider	"Keep in mind that nobody is perfect."
google	to search on Google web site	"Can you google this word for me?"
emergency freak	one who is always panicing	"Who is the emergency freak in your family?"
be on the way	very near, coming	"Help is on the way."
stay on the line	hold on the phone, not to hang up	"Stay on the line for a minute, please.Do not hang up."
engage in rough play	to play in a way that disturbs others	"In this pool, you mustn't engage in rough play."

keep up with	to follow, to stick to	"Keep up with your diet programme."



keep sth. away from sth.	not to approach or touch	"Keep your hands away from your face."
keep sth. out of reach of sb.	not to allow others to touch st.	"Keep all the medicines out of reach of your children."

looking forward to V -ing	to expect sth with great intention	"I'm looking forward to seeing you."
feel on the top of the world	to feel very good and important
